QUICK SHEET

Journal article - one author

Oster, L. (2001). Using the think-aloud for reading instruction. *The Reading Teacher*, 55, 64-69.

NOTE: Authors are listed by surname and initials.

Journal article - two authors

Manton, E. J., & English, D. E. (2002). The college of business and technology's course embedded student outcomes assessment process. *College Student Journal*, 36, 261-267.

NOTE: **Do** not use Volume before the number. Only use the issue number if each new issue begins with page 1. In this case, the issue number is in parentheses after the volume number. i.e. 36(2),1-12.

Book

Diamond, R M. (1995). *Preparing for promotion and tenure: A faculty guide*. Bolton, MA: Anker Publishing Company, Inc.

Book chapter

Gardner, H. Cracking open the IQ box. In S. Fraser (Ed.), *The bell curve wars: Race, intelligence, and the future of America*. (pp. 23-25). New York, NY: BasicBooks.

NOTE: When the editor's name is not in the author position, do not invert. Use initials and surname.

ERIC document (print)

Same format as for book, but give the ERIC number in parentheses at the end of the entry. i.e. (ERIC Document Reproduction Service No. ED417462)

Online journal based on a print source

Wilson, R., & Smallwood, S. (2002, January 18). Battle of wills at Harvard [Electronic version]. *The Chronicle of Higher Education*. 48(19), A8-A10.

NOTE: If the online article has been changed (the format differs from the print version or the page numbers are not indicated, for example), or it includes additional data, you will need to add the date the document was retrieved and the URL.

i.e. Retrieved March 25, 2003, from <http://chronicle.com/chronicle/v48/4819guide.htm>

Journal article retrieved from database
