#### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

#### In Case of Fire

# In Case of Spill or Leak

Ingestion: Prevent eating, drinking, tobacco usage and cosmetic application in areas where there is a potential for

Eye Contact: Where eye contact is likely, use chemical splash goggles.

Skin Contact: Where contact is likely, wear chemical-resistant gloves (such as barrier laminate, butyl rubber, nitrile rubber,

neoprene rubber, polyvinyl chloride [PVC] or Viton), coveralls, socks and chemical-resistant footwear. Stringent housekeeping measures are necessary to prevent translocation of the material from contaminated work surfaces to uncontaminated surfaces (railings, doors, etc.). #### Reproductive/Developmental Effects

Chlorantraniliprole: Animal testing indicates this material did not have neurological, developmental or reproductive effects.

Tests have shown that this material did not cause genetic damage in bacterial or mammalian cell cultures or in animals.

Lambda-Cyhalothrin: Not a developmental or reproductive toxicant.

#### Chronic/Subchronic Toxicity Studies

Chlorantraniliprole: There were no adverse effects in subchronic feeding studies in rats and dogs. There was a decreased body weight gain at high doses in a 28-day feeding study in mice.

Lambda-Cyhalothrin: Reversible paresthesia (abnormal skin sensation).

Reversible clinical signs of neurotoxicity in mammals.

#### Carcinogenicity

Chlorantraniliprole: No animal data are available to define the carcinogenic hazards of this material.

Lambda-Cyhalothrin: No treatment-related tumors in rats or mice.

### Other Toxicity Information

In humans, contact with exposed skin may result in temporary itching, tingling, burning or numbness, called paresthesia. The effect may result from splash, aerosol, or hot vapor contact, or transfer to the face from contaminated gloves and hands. The symptoms normally disappear within 24 hours. Face and genital areas are especially susceptible to this effect. Paresthesia involving the face is also known as "subjective facial sensation" or SFS.

#### **Toxicity of Other Components**

Attapulgite Clay

May cause eye irritation.

# Crystalline Silica, Quartz and Cristobalite

Chronic inhalation exposure to crystalline silica is known to cause silicosis and pulmonary fibrosis in humans. Experimental animals exposed to crystalline silica developed respiratory tract cancers.

# Propylene Glycol

Test results reported in Section 11 for the final product take into account any acute hazards related to the propylene glycol in the formulation.

Reported to cause central nervous system depression (anesthesia, dizziness, confusion), headache and nausea. Chronic dietary exposure caused kidney and liver injury in experimental animals.
