Apparently a number of retirees received it and may be as confused as those attending the meeting. Gail Carbol explained that they were mistakenly sent by Humana. The flier applies only to retirees insured by Humana; UK retirees are not. Humana simply administers the UK plan.

THE ARBORETUM NEEDS YOUR TALENTS

“Summer is’a comin’ in” and with it, Arboretum needs. theArboretum generates numerous and necessary chores from spring to late fall, and must depend on volunteers to help. Work in the Arboretum provides the opportunity to work outside in a serene environment and to learn gardening techniques which can be transferred to home gardens.

Regular workdays in the gardens with Horticulturist Jesse Dahl begin in March on Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. to noon, weather permitting. Jesse needs helpers at all levels of physical exertion and respects any limitations older volunteers may have. Volunteers need only to supply their gloves, sun protection and some basic gardening tools—trowels, hand rakes, knee pads, etc.

Non-gardening events need hosting volunteers; for instance, parking assistants are need for the 20th Annual Arbor Day on April 30, 2011 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Receptionists are needed throughout the summer and fall in the Dorothea Smith Oatts Visitor Center, Monday through Friday, 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., to greet visitors, monitor the visitor log, answer questions, and assist in administrative jobs, such as copying, labeling envelopes, etc.

Help is also needed with entertainment, food/beverage offerings, set up/take down activities, addressing invitations, silent auction at the GALA IN THE GARDEN on Sunday, September 18, 2011.

TWO PIONEERS: IN MEMORIAM

This year, the UK community lost two dedicated pioneers instrumental in changing the University profile:

Abby Marlatt and Constance Wilson

When Abby was Dean of the then College of Home Economics, she became very much involved in the Civil Rights movement, participating and sometimes organizing sit-in groups for local theaters and lunch counters. Because these public activities resulted in unfavorable reactions and subsequent loss of financial gifts to the university, she was relieved of her official and teaching duties and came close to losing her job. She persevered, however, and helped pave the way for UK's acceptance of African-American students and faculty. In 1985, she was awarded a Sullivan Medallion.

Connie Wilson's activities at UK helped to open doors for women faculty. She was the first to be elected Chair of the UK Senate Council and the first woman faculty member on the Board of Trustees. Her statewide profile engendered by her founding of the Central Kentucky Mental Health Association to garner respect for women's abilities.

Because of their commitment and fortitude, UK is a more diverse campus.
