ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Doug Boyd Ph.D. serves as the Director of the Louie B. Nunn Center for Oral History at the University of Kentucky Libraries and is the current president of the Oral History Association. Boyd manages the <u>Oral History in the Digital</u> <u>Age</u> collaborative initiative publishing current best practices and models for collecting, curating and disseminating oral histories. Additionally, Boyd leads the team at the University of Kentucky that envisioned, designed and implemented the open source and free <u>OHMS system</u>, which synchronizes text with audio and video online. Recently, Boyd created the open source digital transfer tool <u>Exactly</u> for safely transferring born-digital archival material to an archive.

Boyd is the co-editor (with Mary A. Larson) of the book <u>Oral History and Digital Humanities: Voice, Access, and Engagement</u> published by Palgrave MacMillan in 2014, and he is the author of the book <u>Crawfish Bottom:</u> <u>Recovering a Lost Kentucky Community</u> which was published in August 2011 by the University Press of Kentucky. He authors the blog <u>Digital Omnium: Oral History, Archives, and Digital Technology</u> and is the author of numerous articles pertaining to oral history, archives and digital technologies.

In addition to writing, Boyd co-hosts and co-produces <u>*The Wisdom Project*</u> podcast, co-hosts the Saving Stories radio program and podcast on Lexington's NPR station WUKY, and he recently served as Executive Producer on the documentaries <u>*Kentucky Bourbon Tales: Distilling the Family Business*</u> and <u>*Quest for the Perfect Bourbon*</u>.

Previously, Doug Boyd managed the Digital Program for the University of Alabama Libraries, served as the Director of the Kentucky Oral History Commission, and prior to that worked as the Senior Archivist for the oral history collection at the Kentucky Historical Society. Doug Boyd received his Ph.D. and M.A. degrees in Folklore from Indiana University and his B.A. degree in History from Denison University in Granville, Ohio.

PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

As we think of tax season, April is an important reminder that the philanthropic arm of the University of Kentucky Association of Emeriti Faculty is our Fellowship Program. Our UKAEF Board wishes to extend a sincere appreciation to members who continue to contribute every year to our fellowship fund. Our Fellowship Program Chair Tom Mullaney shared that we had close to 50 applications from across the University of Kentucky competing for 2016-17 fellowship awards. Please remember that 100% of every dollar contributed goes toward the fellowships with no overhead and is fully tax deductible. Jim Chapman, who is our Treasurer, shared that our members' fellowship program donations for 2016-17 are about the same as last year's.

As a group of professional peers, there are several benefits to UKAEF membership. First and foremost is the benefit of collective advocacy. When problems or questions arise like retirement benefits, parking privileges, health care or representation in discussions about University affairs, knowledgeable UKAEF representatives speak on our behalf. For example, UKAEF members represent the interests of Association members and all retirees on the University retiree benefits committee and on the Faculty Senate where the Association president has full voting rights. Members also profit from the four luncheon programs held each year at the Hilary J. Boone Center. Knowledgeable, engaging speakers address us on diverse topics. These luncheon programs also provide a forum for maintaining friendships and making new acquaintances.

Being mindful of the importance of our health and related research, UKAEF informs members about volunteer opportunities that enable them to continue contributing to the community. As examples, members participate in research studies conducted by the Sanders-Brown Center on Aging, serve the visually handicapped as readers at Central Kentucky Radio Eye, and work with economically disadvantaged youth in the community. We staff our own committees and plan and coordinate our own programs and activities so there is minimum overhead. Dues are \$20 for the academic year which runs from Sept. 1 to Aug. 31 each year and includes membership for spouses. There is an additional charge for lunches at the program meetings and there is also the opportunity to contribute to the scholarship fund. We very much appreciate your membership and will continue to provide a vibrant environment for our emeriti faculty.
