CHANGE OF LUNCHEON PRICE

FOUR AEF FELLOWSHIPS AWARDED

The Fellowship Committee, made up of John Shaw, John Greenway, and Thomas Lillich have chosen four recipients for AEF fellowships from a record total of seventy-eight applications. The four awardees will be introduced and honored at the February luncheon.

Heather Chacon, English. Heather began her doctoral studies in the fall of 2007. Her research is focused on disease in 19th century literature, in particular, the effects of social class and treatment of sick individuals. Her hope is to increase understanding of how conceptions of wellness and illness helped shape social distinctions in America. Heather's teaching activities involve mentoring the writing program, teaching freshman composition, and developing methodology for the teaching of composition. Her goal is a faculty teaching position at the university level.

Patti Meyer, Anthropology. Patti is in the fourth year of her Ph.D. studies. Her research is concerned with transnational and local strategies involved in the use of immigrant care workers for providing health care to elderly people in Genoa. After obtaining her undergraduate degree, Patti was employed for several years in women's programs and as a career counselor at universities in California. At UK, she served as a teaching assistant, instructor, and TA orientation leader. She plans on a future career as a college teacher.

Kausalya Shenoy, Biology. Kay began her doctoral studies in 2004. Her dissertation deals with the effects of endocrine-disrupting pesticides on the male mating signals and behaviors in vertebrates. Prior to coming to the US, she served as a wildlife biologist while obtaining BSc and MS degrees in India. Kay has been a teaching assistant in several BIO courses, and has

She is now working towards a Ph.D. and is the first UK student to have pursued concurrent doctoral degrees in musicology and music performance at UK. Her research deals with the transformation of Scottish musical identity in America through the Scottish pipe band. Erin has been deeply involved in teaching and mentoring in her department and directs a local non-profit organization that gives free music lessons to disadvantaged children. Her ambition is for a career in higher education.
