

**ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE FOR ECONOMICS (GATTON COLLEGE OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS)**

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy both the requirements for an Associate in Science at KCTCS as well as UK Core requirements for the University of Kentucky and pre-major requirements for any bachelor's degree in the Gatton College of Business.

The Gatton College of Business and Economics is a selective admissions college and requires an overall GPA of 2.8 as well as a 2.8 minimum pre-major GPA. Pre-major GPA includes the equivalent of WRD/CIS 110, WRD/CIS 111, MA 113 or MA 123 and MA 162, ACC 201, ACC 202, ECO 201, and ECO 202. Students must also pass B&E 105, a business applications course offered through UK, in order to be admitted into the college.

KCTCS students planning to transfer to the University of Kentucky should work closely with the UK Transfer Advisor each semester to ensure both KCTCS and UK requirements are met.
