

National Certificate in Tobacco Treatment Practice

Participants who successfully complete all the training and evaluation components of our CTTTP-accredited tobacco treatment specialist training program will receive a standardized documentation of completion of training. This is needed to apply for the National Certificate in Tobacco Treatment Practice Exam (<https://www.naadac.org/NCTTP>). Additional certificate application requirements include*:

- A copy of your most recent academic diploma
- If your highest degree is at the high school or Associate degree level, evidence of work experience in human services is required (4,000 hours / 2 years for high school; 2,000 hours / 1 year for Associate)
- Attestation of being tobacco-free for at least 6 months
- Agreement to adhere to the Tobacco Treatment Provider Code of Ethics
- \$150 application fee plus a \$150 testing fee
- Attestation that you have completed 240 hours (post-TTS training program) of tobacco treatment practice experience. Practice hours include activities that fall within the scope of the 11 Tobacco Treatment Core Competencies developed by ATTUD. These are listed in the application form and are required to obtain the certificate. Please note, you can take the NCTTP exam prior to completing these hours.
