- Testing your home is the only way to know your radon level.
- Testing is easy and typically takes only 2 - 3 days.
- High radon levels can be reduced through mitigation.

What Is Radon?

- Radon is a naturally-occurring, radioactive gas.
- Radon is colorless, tasteless and odorless.

How Does Radon Affect Your Health?

- About 15,000 to 22,000 Americans who get lung cancer each year have high exposure to radon.
- Exposure to radon and tobacco smoke increases the chance of developing lung cancer.

What Can You Do About Radon?



Test: Test your home with a radon test kit.

Mitigate: Get your home fixed by a certified professional if the radon level is high.
