

**Campus Security Authority**  
Fraternity and Sorority Life  
University of Kentucky

The University is required by federal and state law to provide certain information to the public about campus crime. Administrative Regulation [6:7 Policy on Disclosure of Campus Security and Crime Statistics](#), implements the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (“Clery Act”) and the state Michael Minger Act (“Minger Act”), as amended from time to time. The University’s *Criteria for Consideration of Student Organization Registration as a Social Fraternity or Sorority* requires house directors and chapter advisors, defined as “campus security authorities” to report all campus crimes, alleged campus crimes, fire, and threats of fires of which they become aware. A “campus security authority” (CSA) is broadly defined as an individual having responsibility for campus security and officials having significant responsibility for student and campus activities. Each CSA must receive training on their duties to report and on Administrative Regulations [6:2](#) and [6:7](#).

**CSA Responsibilities:**

**Do:**

- Dial 911 (from a campus land line) or #UKPD (from a cell phone) to reach UKPD in an emergency!
- Provide resources to survivors for support.
- Inform the individual you must report the incident as a confidential statistic.
- Report all crimes and allegations of crimes to Crisis Management and Preparedness ASAP.

**Do not:**

- Attempt to apprehend the alleged perpetrator.
- Insist survivor contact the police.
- Try to determine if a crime actually took place. That is the responsibility of the police.

**When to Report:**

- Victim or witness reports an incident to you.
- A crime occurred – either on campus, on public property immediately adjacent to campus, on non-campus property that is frequented by students (off-campus chapter house).

- I have been provided with information to contact UK’s Division of Crisis Management and Preparedness should I have questions or need additional resources regarding my role as a CSA at the University of Kentucky.
