Cooperative Learning

Cooperative learning strategies have been incorporated in all classroom lectures and in the lab/clinical settings.

Collaborative Testing

Involved NURB 258 & 351 students in collaborative testing. Students were tested individually first and then they tested with a randomly assigned partner. The group discussion enhances learning and critical thinking.

PowerPoint Case Studies:

PowerPoint lectures containing case studies were utilized to enhance visual learning and incorporate the students in critical thinking skills.

Concept Mapping

Concept mapping was incorporated into the clinical lab setting to enhance student's critical thinking abilities.

Games:

Drug Jeopardy was created for content review and stimulate group thinking and interaction, crossword puzzles, word searches; role playing and impromptu skits were used to reflect different patient situations.

Quick recall type games were utilized for review of unit exams. The games measured group, as well as individual knowledge base in content review.

A Lab Test Match Up and Party game was utilized for student to gain an understanding of lab values.

Bedpan Bonanza game is used to review NURB 351 cardiac and respiratory content prior to examination.

Sweet Introductions game is used to review important content prior to exams.

A Death Exercise has been used in NURB 258 in assisting the students in understanding the loss experienced in illness, to stress the importance of family and significant others and to aid in bringing death to one's conscious mind as a reality.

Pressure Ulcer Prevention game has been used in NURB 247 to stress the importance of pressure ulcer prevention. Students are asked to sit on their nondominant hand for no more than 15 minutes and then inspect the skin condition.

The What I Meant Was game has been used in NURB 258 to enhance the importance of clear step-by-step instructions for patients.

Student use of straws to simulate total lung capacity/restrictive lung disease/asthma in the pediatric population.

Guest Lecturer Respiratory therapist discussed pediatric asthma. The therapist discussed the disease process, management and peak-flow-meters.

Field Trip to U.K. Peds/NICU: The students were taken to the University of Kentucky for a tour of their Pediatric and Neonatal Intensive Care Units. One of the clinical sites did not have the higher acuity of patients that the U.K. facility encounters thus providing an opportunity for the students to experience a higher level of care at a different institution.
