Overview

- Assess
 - What is the scope of the issue?
 - What are our principles and priorities?
- Address
 - What are we doing to address the problem?
- Acknowledge
 - What do we need to acknowledge? What can't we acknowledge?

- Respond
 - Who needs to receive this message, and what is the best way to reach them?
- Review
 - Do these messages align with our principles and priorities?



Overview

- Issues
 - Situations of growing controversy or negative climates that threaten our community or organizational, legal, financial, or reputational stability
 - Can lead to emergencies if not managed

- Anticipated communications timing somewhat in our control
- May require partial activation of UK Crisis Communication Plan



Overview

- President Capilouto responsible for emergency management
 - Designates EVPFA Monday to lead efforts
 - Close coordination with UKPD, UKPR, Provost, Risk Management, Legal, Community of Concern, Student and Academic Life

- Emergencies/Crises
 - Incidents that threaten human life, safety, health, property, or the environment
 - Requires immediate action often urgent and unexpected
 - Often requires a UK Alert
 - May require full activation of UK Crisis Communication Plan

Crisis Communications Response Teams

- Public Information Officer
 - Executive Communication
 - External Relations
 - Distribution

- HealthCare Response
- Resources and Logistics
- Social Media and Media Monitoring



UK Medical Campus Response Team

- Hospital Incident Command Center (ICC)
- Public relations staff positioned to receive information from and relay information to EOC

- Crisis plan for media staging and briefings
 - High-profile incidents when ICC not utilized
- Goals
 - Training opportunities
 - Further integration and collaboration



Training

- Annual tabletops with emergency management
 - Practice with some of our own capabilities removed
 - Practice scenarios that would involve a multitude of agencies and PIOs

• Helicopter crash exercise

 - No UK Alert

- Assault on or near campus
- Student protest
