UKPD Areas of Responsibility

- Primary police authority on all UK property in Kentucky
- Security for 3 hospitals and multiple healthcare clinics
- Security Cameras and Access Control Management
- Campus ID Card Operations
- Crisis Management and Preparedness
- Work closely with public safety partners



UKPD by the numbers

- 61 Sworn Authorized Police Officers
 - (12 added since July 1, 2011)
- 95 Security Officers
- 12 Certified Telecommunications Officers
- 181 Total Employees
- All patrol officers equipped with body cameras



University of Kentucky Police Campus Security System



Authorization

- June 19, 2012 UK BOT passes FCR 7
- Phase 1 authorized \$4.8M scope
- Project completion time of 36 months
- Four components to the security project



Component Parts

- Implement a VMS and installing cameras
- Incorporate access control system into buildings
- Consolidate ID badge operations
- Implement early warning notification system

Resolution

- 2 subjects turned themselves in the same day the pictures released
- Able to interrogate and get them to identify a third person involved from video evidence
- Three arrests for Arson, 2nd (B-Felony) in 25 hours from event



The UK Police and Student Government Association Campus Safety App





What Can the App Do?

- Report tips to campus police, the Community of Concern and soon for maintenance requests.
- Call or text campus 911, while providing realtime GPS location throughout the call or text conversation.
- Look up campus safety resources, emergency procedures and campus information.
- Peer-to-peer SafeWalk allows students to virtually walk together anywhere in the world. Students can also request a ride home from any of three campus ride services.







What Can the App Do?



Call 911, call campus police or message campus 911 right through the app. All three options give first responders real-time GPS information on the caller.

Get home safe with CatsCab, an UK PTS On-Demand Shuttle, SafeCats or watch a friend walk home with SafeWalk







By the numbers

- 4,100 downloads
- 70 tips to police
- 32 emergency contacts (voice or text)
- 1,000+ SafeWalks





July 29, 2015

- 10:38 AM: UK Professor with hearing impairment submits emergency message through LiveSafe stating that he is being chased on Nicholasville Road in a road rage incident.
- 10:38 AM: UK Police dispatchers start a conversation with the professor, through the app and the LiveSafe Dashboard to determine details.
- 10:39 AM: UK Police officers are dispatched and the professor pulls off Nicholasville Road into UK Chandler ER's parking lot.
- 10:40 AM: UK Police officers are in the area circulating for the other driver. The professor notices the officers drive by and tells dispatch that they missed him. Because of the open chat function, dispatchers are able to reassure him that the officers are circulating the area and that an additional officer is en route to his specific location.

Even though the second driver was never located, the professor expresses that before the LiveSafe app he would have had great difficulty in this same situation contacting police and having a conversation as quickly as he did. He even says that when he was being chased he knew that he wanted to get to the UK Campus to use the LiveSafe app and UK Police.





UK Alert Notification

- Emergency message notification system for the purpose of delivering subscription based emergency messages to the campus community.
- Designed to deliver emergency messages via
 - Phones (Voice/Text) VoiP, Cellular, Landline
 - E-mail
 - Social Media
 - Blue Emergency Phones
 - Fire Alarm Integration speakers



UK Alert Notification Continued...

- Text messaging & voice call are optional
- Fundamental goal of UK Alert is to assist in promoting a safe environment for students, faculty and staff
- Designed to be used only during emergency situations that require immediate action by the recipient



UK Alert Registration

- All University students, staff and faculty are automatically registered in UK Alert with their official University email address.
- University encourage students, staff and faculty to add other contact information such as mobile phone numbers and personal e-mail addresses to their UK Alert accounts.
- Parents, media, visitors, and other interested parties may register for UK Alert on a voluntary self-subscription basis.

UK Alert Activation

- Triggered by an event that is <u>CURRENTLY</u> occurring on campus or is considered an <u>IMMEDIATE</u> threat to campus safety
- Immediately upon <u>confirmation</u> that a dangerous situation or emergency exists or threatens campus UK Police Communications issue a UK Alert.



Examples

- Armed Robbery
- Active Shooter or shooting that occurred on campus or adjacent to campus where there is a reasonable belief it threatens the campus community
- Civil Disturbance
- Shots Fired
- Explosion
- Bomb Threat Incident (Credible)

- Hazardous Material (Hazmat spill, Chemical Release)
- Hostage/Barricade/Active Shooter
- Major Utilities Outage
- Natural Gas Leak
- Structural Failure
- Tornado warning
- Severe Weather warning
- University Delay or closure notice



Fire

By the numbers

- 56,983-Number of individuals enrolled in the UK Alert System
 - Anyone with a uky.edu email address is auto enrolled into email notification
 - Text messaging & voice call are optional
- 58.5% -selected the optional registration for Text Message Notification
- Blue Emergency Phone Towers- (exterior notification)
 90% coverage of campus



All Systems Deployed

- Exterior Notification (Talk-a-Phone)
- UK Alert (email, phone, text)
- Automatic locks confirmed secure facilities Main, Student Ctr, POT, Whitehall
- Cats Path cameras utilized to observe subjects, gather evidence, and enhance interrogations
- Well trained, certified Police officers



Current Status

- 98% of the original project completed in 23 months (nearly a year ahead of schedule)
- Healthcare transitioning of cameras is underway with access control transitioning in progress
- Over 70k identification cards issued since the project began



Benefits

- Quick resolution to recent crimes
- Increased awareness to enhance safety
- Broader coverage for emergency notifications
- Project has added benefit in assisting in facilities management
- Development of a Campus Security Standard for all new buildings
- Expansion of the original project by individual units not a part of the original scope
- One card concept



What's Next?

- Virtual patrol of campus
- Implementation of desktop notification software
- Continue Implementation of access control into additional buildings
- Continue to expand the video management platform across campus
- Upgrade radio system upgrade to include a campus wide platform
- Continue to enhance training for campus EOC teams
- Add redundant 911 location
