University of Kentucky Consolidated Operating Budget



Background:

- The recommended consolidated operating budget is balanced
- Sets expenditure authority by area, college, and department
- Includes all components of the University (e.g., academic enterprise, hospital system, clinical patient care, research, philanthropy, athletics)
- Current Funds only using modified accrual basis of accounting

Tuition and Mandatory Fee Parameters Academic Year 2017-18

- Instate undergraduate students: 4% increase ceiling
- Out-of-state undergraduate students: Average <u>net</u> tuition and fee revenue should equal or exceed 100% of direct instructional and student services costs per student
- Graduate and Professional students: tuition and mandatory fees are to be market competitive

Average Tuition and Mandatory Fees Sticker Price - \$5,685

25% of our undergraduate fulltime Kentucky students are from families with a median income of \$19,781. For these students, grants and scholarships covered 92% of tuition and mandatory fees.
