

Primary Care: Growing Access to Care Together

- Primary care expansion in Boyd, Carter and Greenup Counties in Kentucky, and Lawrence and Scioto Counties in Ohio
- Providing increased access to preventive, chronic and acute care to adults in multiple locations
- Added pediatric care in ambulatory settings and providers located within school systems
- Provided new behavioral medicine clinic with six physicians and advanced practice providers (APPs) to help improve mental health access

FY 2020	189,000 visits
FY 2024	254,000 visits
	34.5% increase

- 36 primary care physicians to support preventive medicine and wellness as well as acute care across all ages
- 31 medical specialties in key services:

 - Psychiatry
 - Pulmonary
 - Rheumatology
- 12 cardiovascular specialists to manage heart and vascular disease

- 21 surgical specialties in key services:

 - Pain-Anesthesia
 - Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation
 - Podiatry








Kentucky and Ohio: Urgent Care Center Growth

- Eight Urgent Care Centers located in five counties in Kentucky and Ohio
- New Urgent Care Center opening Summer 2026 to serve Greenup County





Subspecialty Care: Growing Access to Care Together

- Physician-supported outreach in ambulatory centers in Carter, Greenup, Lawrence and Boyd Counties in Kentucky; and Lawrence and Scioto Counties in Ohio:
 - Strategically expanded to assist community need for cardiovascular services in electrophysiology, cardiology, advanced heart failure and vascular surgery.
 - Gynecology, pulmonology, podiatry and rheumatology.
 - Enhanced imaging services available so patients do not have to travel.





UK King's Daughters Ambulatory Network

Programs: Ambulatory Growth Since 2021

- Walk-in care for schools
 - Added four new school districts/independent schools
 - Total FY24
 - 49 schools within nine districts
 - 5,757 visits
 - 3,999 vaccines
- Mobile mammography
 - New state-of-the-art unit added in early 2024
 - Older unit stationed in Floyd County

Community Wellness Center

- Open to public, November 2023
- Currently 1,400+ members
 - 660 UKKD employee members
- Fitness classes included with membership
- Weekly adult fitness program







Specialty Growth — UK King's Daughters Radiation Oncology Practice Background

Ashland Radiation Oncology dba Tri-State Regional Cancer Center



- Independent radiation medicine practice located at 706 23rd Street, Ashland, KY.
- Only radiation oncology center in the Ashland market.
- Owns two Certificate of Need licenses for megavoltage radiation linear accelerators in Boyd County.
- Located directly across from the current emergency department on UK King's Daughters main campus.
- Current practice owners are nearing retirement (within 3-5 years) and are actively looking for options to sell the practice.



Specialty Growth — UK King's Daughters Radiation Oncology Practice Background

Ashland Radiation Oncology dba Tri-State Regional Cancer Center

- The practice appraised for \$13.7M, including costs of appraisals, land surveys, closing costs and other capitalized costs.
 - Acquisition includes purchase of 8,224 sq. ft.
 building including two lead-lined vaults for radiation therapy.
 - Acquisition includes purchase of two licensed Linear Accelerators — a True Beam and older Varian. The Varian is nearing or at end of life.
- UK King's Daughters cancer program currently does not have radiation oncology services; this is an opportunity to enhance the clinical program.




Emergency, Imaging and Entrance Construction Update
