




Second Fall Retention Rate: Under-Represented Minority Students





Second Fall Retention Rate: First Generation Students



Six Year Graduation Rate: Under-Represented Minority Students


Fall 2007 to Fall 2012 Freshman Cohorts - Six Year Graduation






Six Year Graduation Rate: First Generation Students

Fall 2008 to Fall 2012 Freshman Cohorts - Six Year Graduation






Academic Preparation and Second Fall Retention Rate: Under-Represented Minority Students





Academic Preparation and Second Fall Retention Rate: First Generation Students







College Readiness (APP) Pilot Program



- Admitted underprepared students in April rather than over the summer to implement a proactive intervention
- Provided an Academic Coach to all APP students
- Proctored placement exams with online, selfpaced tutorial support




College Readiness (APP) Pilot Program Results

- In the 2018 first year class **613** students did not meet college readiness benchmarks in at least one area
- By the beginning of the 2019 Spring Term, **455** of these students had resolved all readiness issues
- Of the **158** students who had not cleared the college readiness benchmark in at least one area, **105** students had only a math readiness issue remaining
- Expanding the program (starting even earlier)
- More than 100 admitted students for Fall 2019 already are working with academic coaches in order to address their readiness areas



Moving Forward

- Create a comprehensive, coordinated Summer Bridge program that includes central offices and the academic colleges.
- Expand Summer 2018 pilot program that provides Academic Coaches to all incoming APP students (Math, English, Reading)
- Sustain and increase student scaffolding, particularly for first generation students
