








MVP team (MAVARIC): <u>Magnesium And Verapamil After Recanalization in Ischemia of the Cerebrum: Update</u>

Pls: Justin F. Fraser, MD and Gregory J. Bix, MD, PhD

- Combine IA Verapamil + Magnesium (Mg) after thrombectomy in human subjects
- Human Randomized Blinded Outcome Assessment Trial
 - 15 patients in each group (control vs Verapamil/Mg)
 - Undergo thrombectomy plus IA infusion
- Trial Opened: October 10, 2017



Graduate Medical Education (GME)

- New programs
 - Adult Cardiothoracic Anesthesiology Fellowship, Epilepsy Fellowship, Bowling Green Internal Medicine Residency, Bowling Green Cardiology Fellowship, and Bowling Green Transitional Year Residency
 - Transitioned to ACGME accreditation: Maternal Fetal Medicine Fellowship, Gynecologic Oncology Fellowship, and Selective (Surgical) Pathology Fellowship
- Three regional GME sites:

 - Morehead (2000)
 - Bowling Green (2016)
- UK College of Medicine selected to participate in the ACGME Patient Safety Leaders Collaborative




ACGME Program 2016-17 Accreditation Compliance*


Annual Total ACGME Residents and Fellows





GME 2017 Graduate Data


2017 Graduate Practice Location






Efforts to Improve Efficiencies
