FY 2023-24 BUDGET REVISIONS

<u>Recommendation</u>: that the Board of Trustees authorize and approve the following revisions to the FY 2023-24 budget. The budget revisions outlined below will increase the University of Kentucky's current funds budget by \$23,050,000 from \$6,780,322,900 to \$6,803,372,900.

 <u>Comments</u> – The 2022 General Assembly appropriated \$10 million to the university pending the Markey Cancer Center achieving the National Cancer Institute designation as a Comprehensive Cancer Center. As the designation has been achieved, the additional state funds will be realized. These funds will be used to support the Markey Cancer Center's research programs.

 <u>Comments</u> – The \$11,650,000 increase in Nongovernmental Grants and Contracts is due to additional funds from Kentucky Medical Science Foundation, Inc. (KMSF) to support the Deans Academic Enrichment Program in the College of Medicine.

An additional \$1,400,000 of State and Local Grants and Contracts is estimated to be received from the Cancer Research Institutions Matching Fund in the State Treasury. The funds will be used to support the Markey Cancer Center's research programs.
