





1. Introduction

As of summer 2006, the University of Kentucky has provided summer training in Orff Schulwerk for in-service music teachers for twenty years. Our program engages summer visiting instructors to provide the three levels of training certified by the American Orff Schulwerk Association as well as courses in a variety of topics. The objective of the certification is to provide professional development to music teachers in Orff Schulwerk which develops creative teaching using effective music pedagogy.

3. Admission Requirements

Bachelor Degree or beyond, admissible at the post-baccalaureate non-degree status

4. Requirements for Completion (12 credits total)

1. Level One Orff Schulwerk, MUS 560-561 (2-4 credits);
2. Level Two Orff Schulwerk, MUS 560-561 (2-4 credits);
3. Level III or Advanced Orff, MUS 560-561* (2-4 credits);
4. Certificate Project, MUS 750* (1-3 credits)

Completion requires a 3.0 GPA minimum, and 12 credits obtained within five years.

*Advanced Orff and MUS 750 will be replaced by MUS 666 when MUS 666 is approved by the University Senate.

5. Rationale for Continuation of Graduate Certificate in Orff Schulwerk

The UK program has expanded in recent years and has attracted participation from both in-state and out-of-state teachers. The graduate certification lends official approval to these teachers and is well received by all. Teachers are happy to combine this training and apply the credits towards requirements to renew their teaching certificate. A number of them started with the first course and decided to continue graduate studies leading to a degree at UK. Coupled with distance learning courses during the year, this summer program enables teachers to keep their job and work on a graduate degree simultaneously.

University of Kentucky Graduate Certificate in Orff Schulwerk

Music teachers from Kentucky as well as from other places can now enroll for credits to be applied towards a new University of Kentucky Graduate Certificate in Orff Schulwerk. The University of Kentucky is one of only a few institutions in the United States with Orff Schulwerk Concentration at the graduate level. Orff Schulwerk is the music approach created by composers Carl Orff and Gunild Keetman. It is a way to teach and learn music using poems, rhymes, games, songs, and dances as basic materials. The emphasis is on students as improvisers and performers. The University of Kentucky offers Schulwerk Teacher Training courses in the summers, taught by the most prestigious summer faculty from different parts of the country. The content follows strict guidelines of the American Orff-Schulwerk Association. Training is given at Levels 1, 2, 3 and advanced masters courses in different topics such as curriculum design and other topics.

4. Certificate Project MUS 750 1-3 cr. (Prerequisite: Orff Teacher Training Level 2)

Award of the Certificate: Completion of certificate curriculum requirements with a minimum of 3.0 GPA within five years.

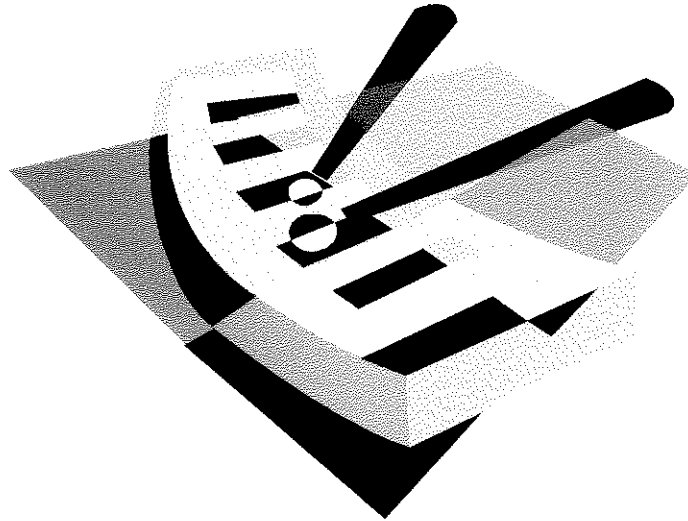
